INTERVENTION MODEL

<u>JuventudES</u> incorporates the most successful practices from IYF. The program model includes:

32 Passport to Success (PTS)² lessons which is a methodology designed by IYF to develop critical social-emotional skills for life and work.

Knowledge and technical skills necessary to enter sectors with greater formal employment opportunities for young people

The integration of both components in an 8-week course, taught by trained teachers, in sites close to the areas where the young participants live.

Recruiters who publicize the program and call/enroll young people who meet the entry profile.

Counseling that accompanies, motivates and supports each participant to elaborate a **Life Plan** oriented to the search for educational and/or work opportunities, in order to achieve the goals established by themselves.

Peace Promoter that activates attention and prevention protocols in the areas of coexistence; and security, in order to maintain a harmonious and healthy environment in the replication sites.

IMPLEMENTATION

Mexico City areas with a high presence of Opportunity Youth, with the collaboration of public and civil society institutions to which technical assistance is provided free of charge to apply the model according to their organizational structure

The labor market assessment conducted by IYF allows us to identify the sectors that offer the greatest employment opportunities for young participants in each of the regions of Mexico City.



1) Opportunity Youth: 1)Individuals aged 16 to 29 who do not studyor work (no formal job) and face multiple barriersto access qu ality jobs (lack of work experience, prejudi ce, responsibilities at home, lack of skills) or to complete their projected studies (lack of resources, lack of educational spaces, care activities). According to the Global Opportunity Youth Network (GOYN) diagnosis conducted at the end of 2020, nearly 618 thousand Opportunity Youth were identified in CDMX, with 52% being women. 2) PTS Impact: The George Washington University partnered with IYF to assess the impact and determine the monetary value of its flagship life skillscurriculum, Passport to Success. Using the Social Return on Investment methodology, researchers found that every dollar invested in PTS yields a \$7.17 gain in stakeholder benefits over five years.
