In Colombia, information and communications technology (ICT) is driving significant transformations across various sectors. Companies have increased their investments in digital solutions, recognizing the importance of technology for innovation and operational optimization.

A study by the Ministry of Information and Communications Technology (MinTIC) revealed that the ICT sector is growing at annual rates of 3% in Medellín and 4% in Bogotá. However, this progress presents an urgent challenge: the lack of individuals with the appropriate skills to fill vacancies in the sector.

In 2020 were recorded:

36,184 vacancies were registered in the ICT sector,

26,017 students were qualified to fill them.

This disparity highlights the **need to strengthen** educational and training processes to close the talent gap and meet the sector's growing demand.

Google Professional Certificate

Training to obtain a professional Google certificate in IT Support, Data Analysis, Project Management, or UX Design, through a combination of online and in-person courses.

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Socioemotional Skills

A curriculum that develops socioemotional and life skills, along with career guidance through IYF's "Discover Your Vocation" (DTV) initiative.



Complementary Activities

Activities and skill-building opportunities to help young participants consolidate knowledge and prepare for job searching, entry, and retention in formal IT sector employment.






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Achieving this gender parity empowers young women and helps break stereotypes in the technology sector.
