Summit of the Americas

- Brings together Heads of State and Government of the 34 member states.
- <u>Goal</u>: to discuss common concerns, seek solutions and develop a shared vision on economic, social or political issues that are of particular interest to the region.
- To date, five Summits have been held: Miami in 1994, Santiago de Chile in 1998, Quebec City in 2001, Mar del Plata in 2005, and Port of Spain in 2009.

- The leaders committed to advance young people by:
- expanding their economic opportunities
- providing access to comprehensive education and training for in-demand skills
- opening avenues for leadership
- promoting healthy lifestyles.

The Obra Mandate

- President Obama proposed a pilot program to form partnerships with countries that have the highest levels of inequality, significant numbers of unemployed and at risk youth, and considerable potential for leveraging additional public and private sector resources.
- Focus would be on youth-at-risk, including out-of-school youth, under-employed youth, and ex-gang members.
- This is the Obra Mandate

 - strengthen local efforts through sharing experiences across the region
