



**NIGERIA IS THE LOWEST RANKED** country in the Index. Similar to other sub-Saharan Africa countries, Nigeria's last place ranking is largely driven by weak scores across all six domains, with the exception of citizen participation. Despite the challenges in the national environment, Nigerian youth report a generally positive outlook and particularly high optimism in economic opportunity.
