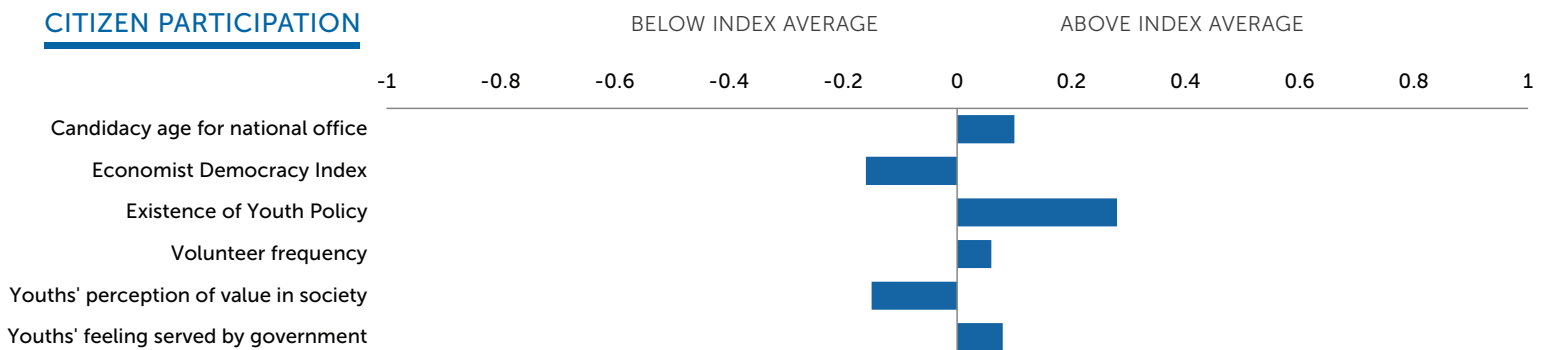

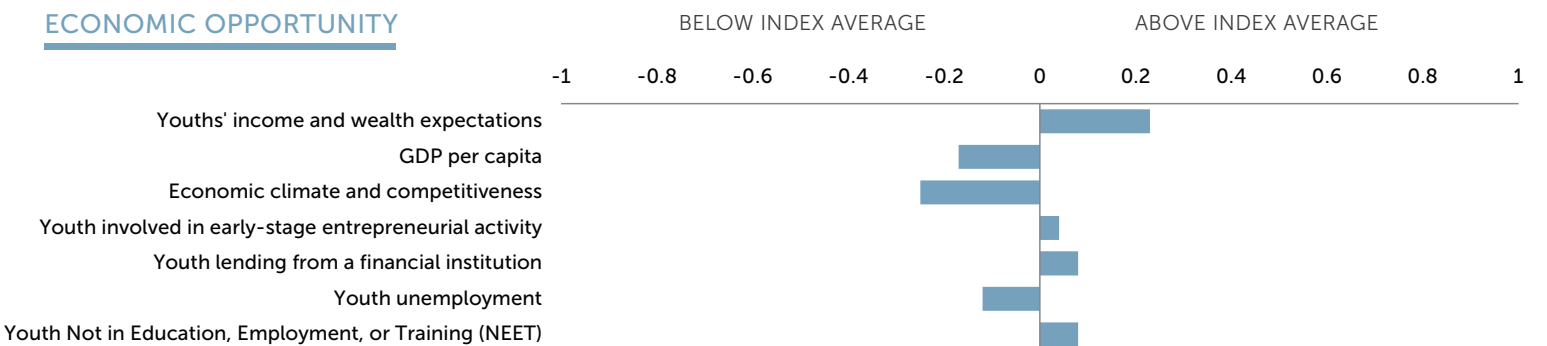

AT 27TH PLACE, KENYA ranks in the lowest of the four tiers of youth wellbeing along with its neighboring countries, Tanzania and Uganda. Similar to other low income countries, Kenya ranks highest in citizen participation, which is in part a result of an existing youth policy. Generally, Kenyan youths' perceptions align with their national environment and the youth specific measures.
