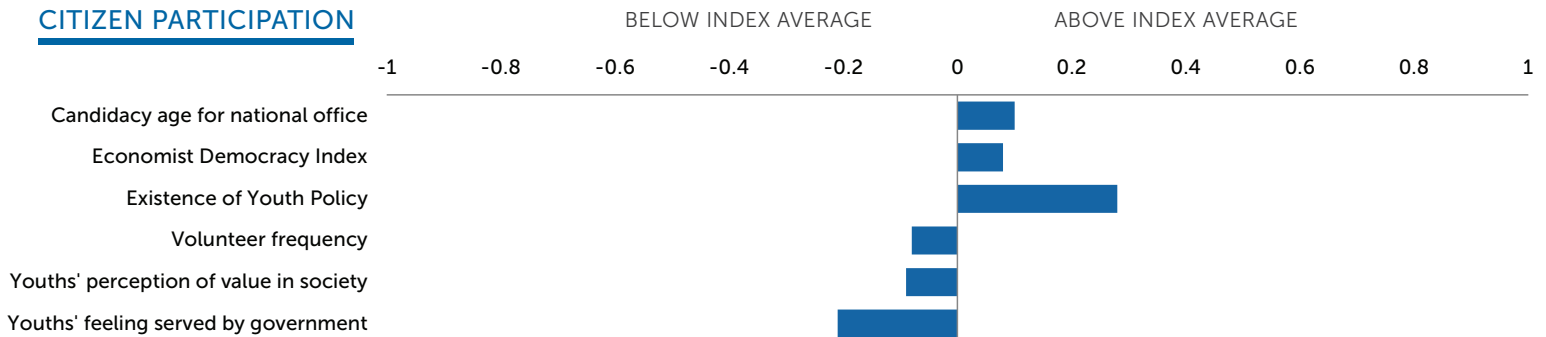

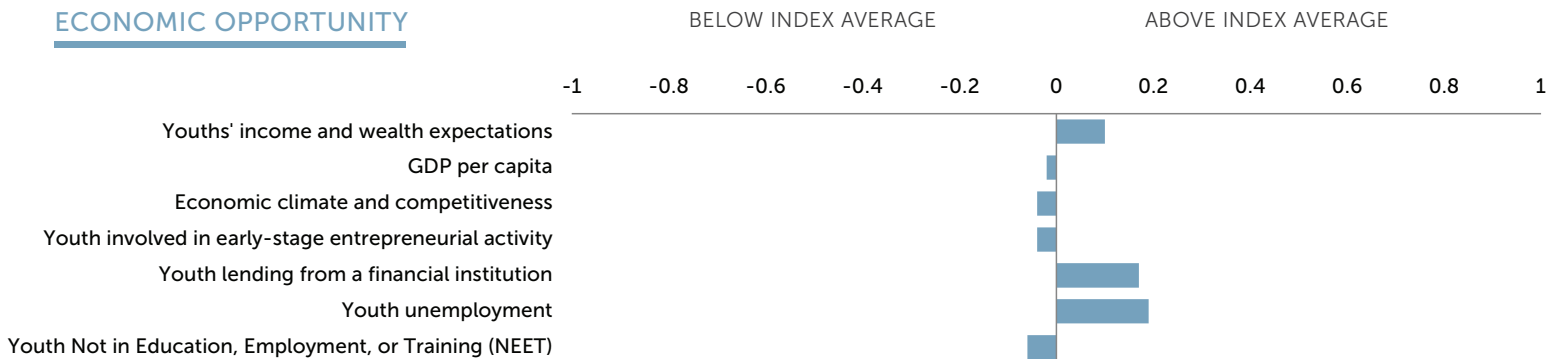

AT 16TH PLACE in the overall rankings and landing in the third of the four tiers of youth wellbeing, Mexico is the lowest ranking country in the Americas region. Within its OECD peer group, Mexico only outranks Turkey. Mexican youth are less optimistic about the future, which negatively impacts Mexico's overall ranking. By contrast, Mexico scores well in the ICT domain.
