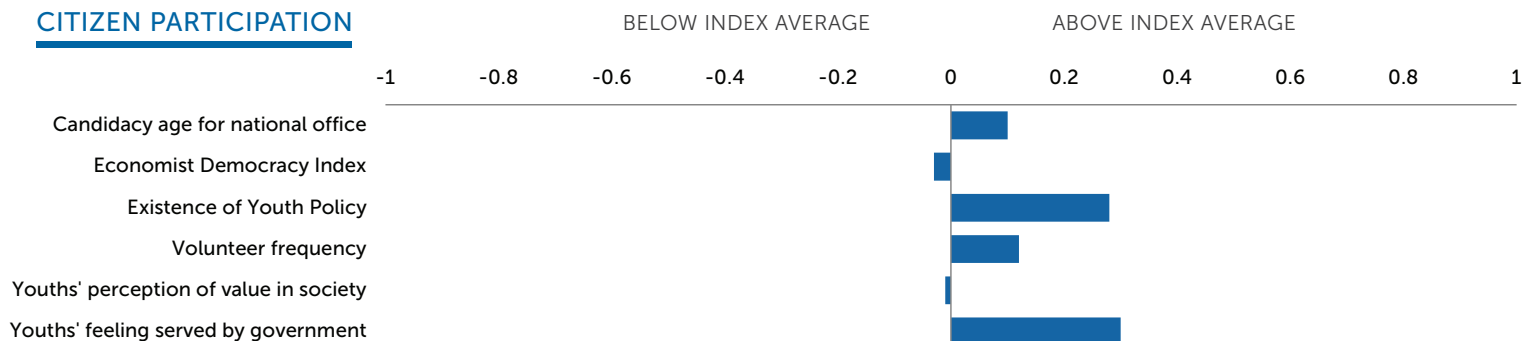

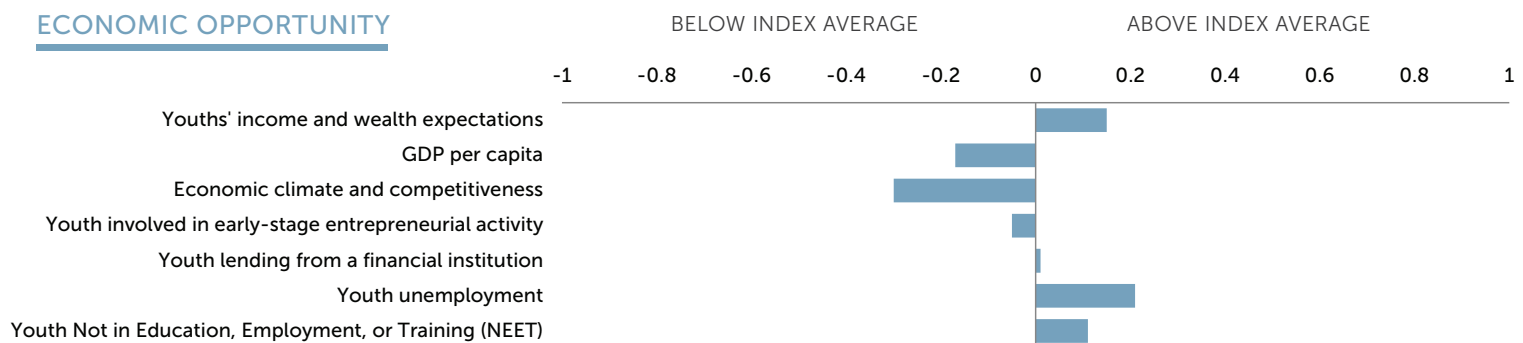

AT 28TH PLACE, TANZANIA comes in fourth among the six sub-Saharan African countries, and lands in the last of the four tiers of youth wellbeing, with the other two low income countries in the Index—Kenya and Uganda. Tanzania’s lower ranking is driven largely by poorer performance in education, health and ICT. In the citizen participation, economic opportunity, health, and safety and security domains, youth are generally optimistic about their current status and future prospects.
